Champion of Champions

- This competition will be a shoot-out event involving 10 players.
- The qualifiers for this event are as follows:
 - 3 Men:
 - 3 Ladies:
 - 3 Seniors:
 - 1 Junior:
- Players will play using their full course handicap.
- Players will compete in the shoot out from the tee that they gained entrance to this event.
- The competition is planned to be played in the early afternoon. Players are not allowed to play the course in the morning before the competition starts. Any player who does play the course during the morning will be disqualified from the competition in accordance with the rules of golf for practising on the course.
- The competition will play holes 1 to 8 and then 18.
- All 10 players will tee off from the first tee. 9 from the second, and so on.
- Scoring for each hole will be decided on the players Nett score against their relevant tee stroke index.
- The player with the highest nett score will be eliminated after each hole.
- In the event of more than one player with the highest nett score there will be a sudden death shoot-out with the least successful eliminated.
- This will result in 2 players contesting the last hole, the 18th to finish in front of the clubhouse.
- If this hole finishes equal, then it will be replayed until one player is the winner.
- If a player qualifies for this competition but is unable to play, it is important they notify the organiser at the earliest possible time so that a substitute can be arranged.
- If the player fails to turn up on the day without good reason the organisers reserve the right to deem that person ineligible for future Champion of Champions.
- The decision of the referee will be final.

Champion of Champions

Rules of the Competition

- This competition will be a shoot-out event involving 10 players.
- The competition will include winners from all sections (Men, Ladies, Seniors & Juniors).
- There will be 3 qualifying competitions from the Men's, Seniors, and Ladies sections and 1 from the Juniors.
- The club competitions eligible to provide entrants to this event are as follows:
Men: Club Championship Gross, Club Championship Nett & Battle of Britain.
Ladies: Club Championship Gross, Club Championship Nett & Midsummer Trophy.
Seniors: Club Championship Gross, Club Championship Nett & Robin Burton Cup.
Juniors: Club Championship Gross.
- A player can only qualify once for this competition in the year.
- If a player wins more than one qualifying event, they will qualify from their first event and the runner up in their second qualifying event will enter the shoot-out.
- Players will play using their full course handicap.
- Players will compete in the shoot out from the tee that they gained entrance to this event.
- The competition is planned to be played in the early afternoon. Players are not allowed to play the course in the morning before the competition starts. Any player who does play the course during the morning will be disqualified from the competition in accordance with the rules of golf for practising on the course.
- The competition will play holes 1 to 8 and then 18.
- All 10 players will tee off from the first tee. 9 from the second, and so on.
- Scoring for each hole will be decided on the players Nett score against their relevant tee stroke index and Par.
- The player with the highest nett score will be eliminated after each hole.
- In the event of more than one player with the highest nett score there will be a sudden death shoot-out with the least successful eliminated.
- At each hole there will be a predetermined challenge in the form of a putt off if required. The order of play will be drawn and whilst waiting their turn players will be expected to look away.
- This will result in 2 players contesting the last hole, the 18th to finish in front of the clubhouse.
- In the event of the players with equal nett score on the last hole, they will return to the Tee and replay the hole until there is a winner.
- If a player qualifies for this competition but is unable to play, it is important they notify the organiser at the earliest possible time so that a substitute can be arranged.
- If the player fails to turn up on the day without good reason the organisers reserve the right to deem that person ineligible for future Champion of Champions.
- The decision of the referee will be final.

Recommendations for the Organisers

- The day will require a number of people being involved to ensure the competition runs as smoothly as possible.
- The following is a suggestion of positions to fill.
- **Announcer:** Will introduce the players onto the first Tee. The introduction should include the player's name. Competition from which they qualified and the score in that competition. The players handicap index and their course handicap for the day.
- **Referee:** Will make all on course decisions for the competition.
- **Note:** The Announcer and Referee can be one person, or it can be two individuals doing separate jobs. It should not be two people doing both jobs.
- **Recorder:** This person will be responsible for completing the scores of all players on each hole. They will inform the Announcer and Referee if there is to be a Shoot-out and which players are involved. At the end of the Shoot-out, they will advise the Announcer which player is eliminated.
- **Ball Spotters:** As many as are available particularly in the early holes of the competition.

Notes

Hncp: Will be full course handicap

Tee: Will be the tee that the player qualified from

P: Will be the drawn order in which the players will play from the first tee

G: Players gross score on the hole

N: Players nett score on the hole after deducting handicap allowance on the hole

Be Aware: The Par for the 2nd hole is different for Red tees (4) & White Tees (3).

If a player from the Red tee nett score is 4 & a player from the White tee nett scores is also 4: Red tee players score is better.

If a player from the Red tee nett score is 3 & a player from the White tee nett scores is also 3: Red tee players score is better.

If a player from the Red tee nett score is 4 & a player from the White tee nett scores is 3: Players scores are equal.

when a player is eliminated, mark the next available 'G' column with 'X'

If the last hole is played between a Male and Female player then be aware that the hole is played against their relevant Par score.

Use rules as defined for 2nd hole but this time Red tee is par 4 & White tee is par 5.

Champion of Champions

Caddies

- What you can do:
 - You can take care of your players clubs.
 - You can clean the ball whenever it is lifted and between holes.
 - You can give advice to your player.
 - When your player is putting you can take charge of the flag.
 - It can be left in the hole.
 - It can be removed from the hole.
 - It can be attended but only for your own player.
- What you cannot do:
 - You must not stand behind the line of your players intended shot when they are ready to play.
 - This line also extends beyond the hole when on the putting green.
 - You should not touch the line of your players stroke at any time.
 - You cannot give advice to any player other than the one you are caddying for.
 - You should not take control of the flag for any other player unless asked to do so.
